Shelter Plus Care participation in Coordinated Entry

While receiving rental assistance through the Shelter Plus Care Program (SPC Program), participants are required to maintain an ongoing relationship with a service provider affiliated with the SPC Program that will provide case management and other support services as necessary and appropriate to assist them to retain their housing.

Annually, SHRA and Case Management providers enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to identify the role and responsibilities of the Housing Authority and the Service Provider in implementing the SPC Program. Participation requirements for Coordinated Entry are noted in the MOUs.

The current MOUs expire on March 31, 2019.

- SHRA reports that they project no/few newly issued vouchers in Sacramento for the 2019 contract year. Referrals will consist of existing voucher turnover.
- SSF will work with providers who renew the MOU to develop detailed Case Management profiles. This will examine agency areas of expertise, program participant requirements, staff capacity, location, and other details in an effort compile a comprehensive overview of agency services.
- Prioritized clients will be identified in the community, and will be paired to providers who would be the best match for their individual needs.
- Agency capacity for new clients, as well as identified units in which to utilize the vouchers will also affect referrals.
