She discussed the national Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services (CLAS) standards on governance, leadership, and workforce; the different tiers in the California Arts Council strategic framework/decision support tool; a racial equity impact assessment; and a racial equity toolkit. She continued on: what do they generally have in common, looking at what other communities are doing (Marin County, Multnomah County (Portland, OR), Santa Clara County, Los Angeles County), themes for action within the Homelessness System, and themes for action with Homelessness Partners.
