Discussion: Majority of other CoC's are also postponing. City/County sweeps are continuing and interest to coordinate ceasing of those activities to improve PIT count efforts. Funding applications/allocations are still operating with 2019 unsheltered numbers, and will continue until new PIT count is collected. HMIS participation would assist in accuracy of data. Reduced volunteer and outreach methodology to accommodate for covid implications. PIT Committee will be meeting at 9a on 3rd Thursday to discuss encampments and further efforts. Surveys only available in English, reoccurring equity issue.

Discussion: Add a performance indicator from length of time from contact to shelter/housing. Bottleneck from shelter to housing, increase housing availability. Need more people on the ground, when sweeps happen information and solutions are absent, incorrect resources are being given. Shelter needs wraparound services. Provider referral follow ups and warm handoffs.

Discussion: City of Sacramento approved investment contingent on matches from County and CoC. Excitement on moving forward. Outreach/marketing for education to support the public and service providers on how to help is intentionally built into the proposal. Surrounding cities are included in project participation, with two of four contributing on the core team. Ongoing evaluation of the process is essential to continuous improvement of proposal. CalAIM and MediCal insurers involvement inquiry: managed care plans have been involved in information sessions and follow up to educate on HMIS and case conferencing integration (Note: CalAIM only pays for housing not shelter access). Providers are finding a system glitch that HMIS does not record insurance, which is needed to work through the by-name list through a shared data agreement. Intentionally set up safeguards regarding 2-1-1 being under the Goodwill umbrella and offering multiple services including housing.

This memo proposes three items for approval by the CoC Board:

- An increase in total board membership from 25 members to 30 members.
- Appointment of six new members, including one member to fill a vacated seat and five members to fill the newly created seats.
- Approval of the 2022 Executive Committee slate.

Background on each of these action items is provided below.

Membership Cap Increase

The current CoC Governance Charter establishes a cap of 25 members for the CoC Board. This cap has been in place since the board was established in 2011. In the last two years, the CoC has increased its emphasis on engaging a broader group of stakeholders in the work of the CoC, with an emphasis in the last year on improving new member recruitment strategies. This work has paid off, resulting in 33 new member applications submitted in response to this year's recruitment efforts. At the same time as recruitment has increased, board resignations and members subject to term limits have decreased, resulting in no open seats for the prospective new members. The Governance Committee met on March 3, 2022 to discuss this matter and recommend the following:

ACTION: Amend the CoC Governance Charter to increase the board membership cap from 25 member to 30, effective immediately. With approval of this action item, the board is able to appoint five new members from the group of 33 who applied.

New Members

The current membership of the CoC Board is comprised of 24 members. The roster as of March 3, 2022, prior to the appointment of any new members today, is attached. County Health Services representative Chevon Kothari recently resigned, recommending her colleague Jenine Spotnitz be appointed to represent this perspective. Ms. Spotnitz submitted an application for consideration in the current new membership slate being presented today. The Governance Committee supports this appointment. Additionally, with the increase in the membership cap to 30 members, five additional new applicants are also recommended for appointment. The names and affiliations of all new member appointments are listed below. All new members are appointed to an initial two-year term, effective March 2022 to February 2024.
