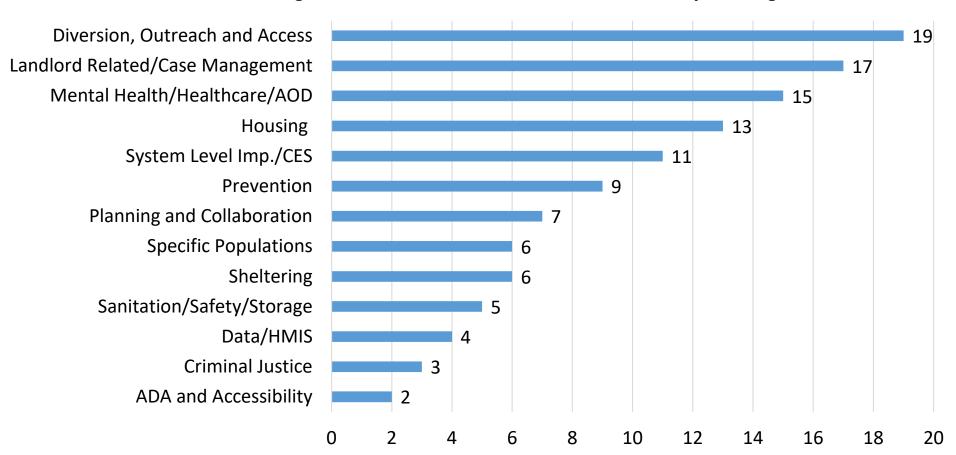

CE Re-Housing

Funding Recommendation - \$2,290,000

- HHAP Eligible Activity Rental Assistance and Rapid Re-Housing
- Re-Housing through coordinated entry
- Potential partnership with the County FHP program
- Includes limited-term flexible assistance, intensive case management services, property related tenant services (PRTS)

Landlord Engagement and Incentives

Funding Recommendation - \$850,000

- HHAP Eligible Activity Landlord Incentives
- Address existing programs with vouchers or rental subsidies unable to secure housing
- Estimated over 450 federal housing opportunities delayed or not realized in Sacramento
- Needs funding and staffing to coordinate landlord engagement community wide
- Assistance to incentivize landlords

Access and Diversion

Funding Recommendation - \$1,600,000

- HHAP Eligible Activity
 - Outreach and Coordination
 - Prevention and Shelter Diversion to Permanent Housing
- Address lack of funding, resource and capacity for access to homeless response system
- Diversion program to help reduce the number of families and individuals experiencing homelessness, reduce the demand for shelter beds

Prevention

Funding Recommendation - \$500,710

- HHAP Eligible Activity Prevention and Shelter Diversion to Permanent Housing
- Number of persons entering homelessness outpacing number of persons leaving homelessness
- Prevention programs intended to:
 - Help quickly regain stability in current housing
 - Connect to other types of assistance and family support
 - Problem solving conversations
 - Housing search and placement services
 - Flexible financial assistance

Youth Process for HHAP Funding

- Homeless Youth Task Force developed a project recommendation with the Youth Advisory Board (YAB) in December.
- Youth groups presented preliminary idea to the CoC Board on January 8, 2020.
- City, County and SSF met with Homeless Youth Taskforce and youth provider leadership prior to community meeting.
