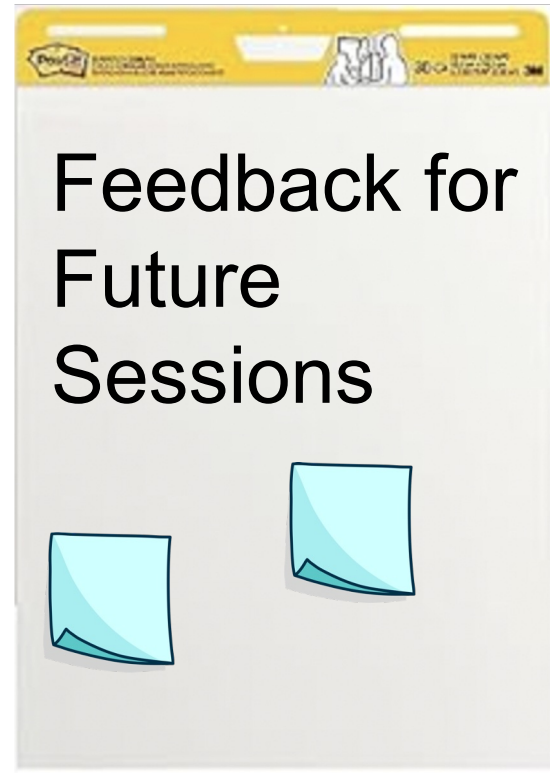

Setting a **clear and achievable path** to preventing and ending homelessness in the region

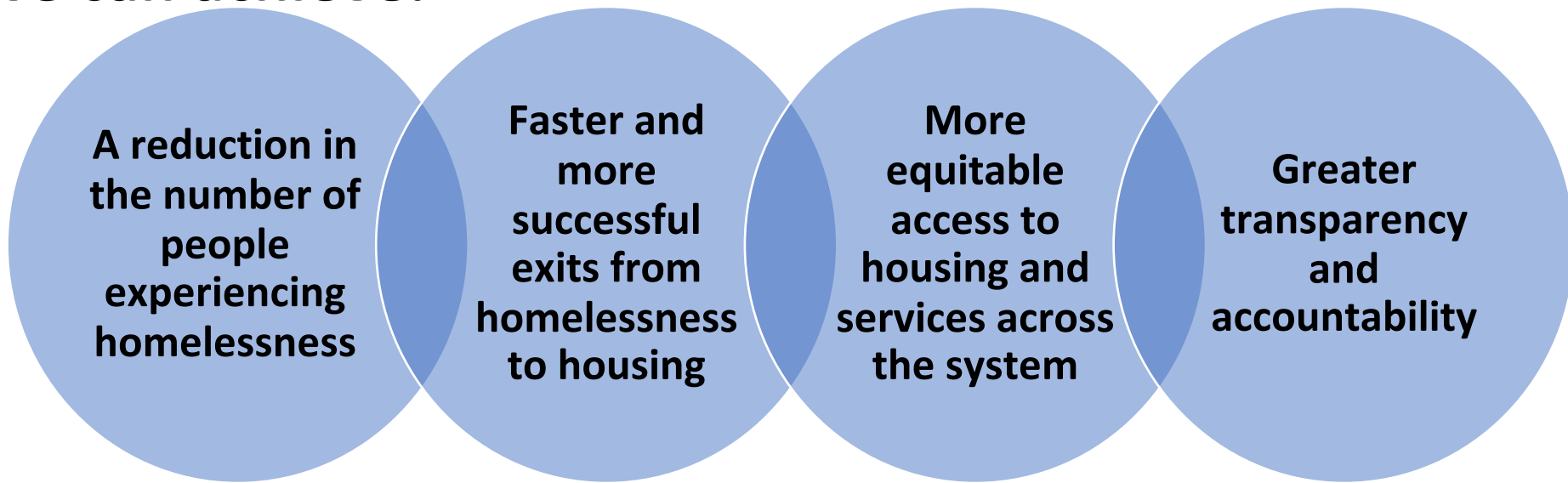
With a **comprehensive framework** for measuring progress

The Goal

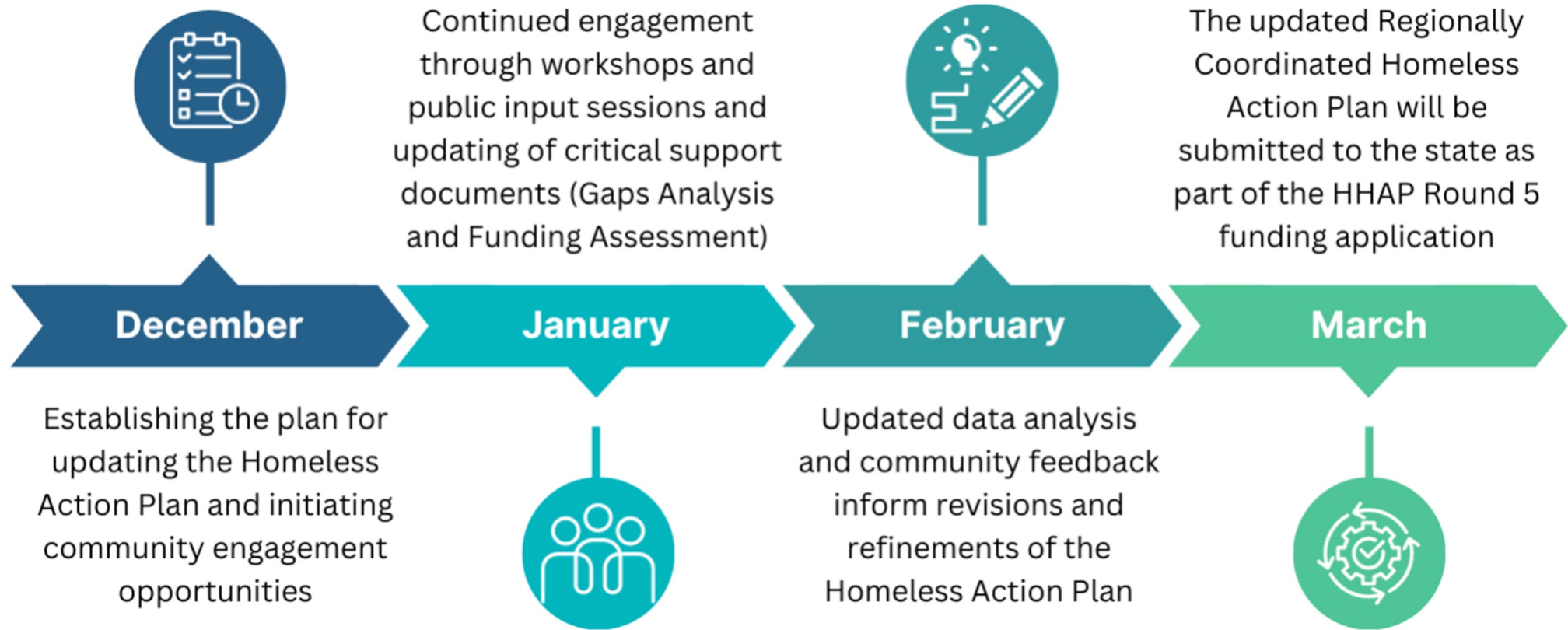
Improve and build upon the progress made under Local Homeless Action Plan (LHAP) to:
