




# Race/Ethnicity Comparisons

## Recap: 2024 PIT Count

### TOTAL HOMELESSNESS


6,615 people were since 2022 experiencing homelessness.

#### **UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS**

3,944 people were living on the since 2022 street, far fewer than in 2022.

#### SHELTERED HOMELESSNESS

2,671 people were being sheltered, since 2022 a significantly larger proportion.



Overall homelessness count remains 19% above 2019 levels.

# **Estimated Counts for a Point in Time in January 2024**


## **HMIS Homeless Count is Rising**

The increase in homelessness over the past two years was more pronounced in 2024.

#### In January 2024:

- HMIS showed 5,434 people experiencing homelessness
- The PIT showed **6,615** people experiencing homelessness.

The most recent count is 6,312.

#### SHELTERED VS. UNSHELTERED


The increase in homelessness shown by HMIS is mostly unsheltered.

#### **Unsheltered Counts Rising**

Unsheltered count from HMIS is slowly approaching the unsheltered PIT count.

#### **Sheltered Counts Stable**


Sheltered count from HMIS has remained somewhat consistent for the past two years.










# **Upcoming Inventory**

#### **Emergency Shelter**

• +750 additional beds (by end of 2025)

#### **Permanent Supportive Housing**

• +813 additional beds (by end of 2027)



## **Data Debrief**

- Overall homeless count: the number of people HMIS shows as homeless on a month-to-month basis is higher this year
- Entering homelessness: the number of people newly identified as homeless on a month-to-month basis is lower this year,
- Leaving homelessness: exits to permanent housing are lower this year
- Market forces: vacancy rates are lower and rental rates are higher
- Evidence points to better data coverage and (likely) more people experiencing homelessness
